Details of Program:	With the funds that were awarded to our Chapter this past year — we were able to provide playing opportunities to all our participants, regardless of an inability to pay.  Through the First Tee Program, we are strengthening our young people both emotionally through the Nine Core Values and physically through the Nine Healthy Habits. To tie the First Tee Philosophy and "Growth of the Game" — PGA/Les Schwab Junior Golf Grants, I was able to provide playing opportunities at Suntides GC in Yakima. During class is where I would talk about the Rules of Golf and the etiquette that is expected when playing golf. It is there that I was able to not only teach fundamentals to every age and ability — but the owners of Suntides GC gave us a special season ticket price so my older and more experienced kids could get a pass to come and play not only during class times but any time. I have always believed that the best way to learn to play a sport/game is to play on the course. This allowed the kids to get out and learn Rules of Golf, etiquette and pace of play.  *Teach fundamentals of the golf swing — but give players opportunities to play the game;  *Help them learn — but make it FUN;  *Provide play times away from class time, so they can learn the game;  *Make sure they play with different people — adults and juniors alike;  *Set up formats that are fun and inviting, e.g. scrambles, alternate shot, etc. to make their experience inviting;
